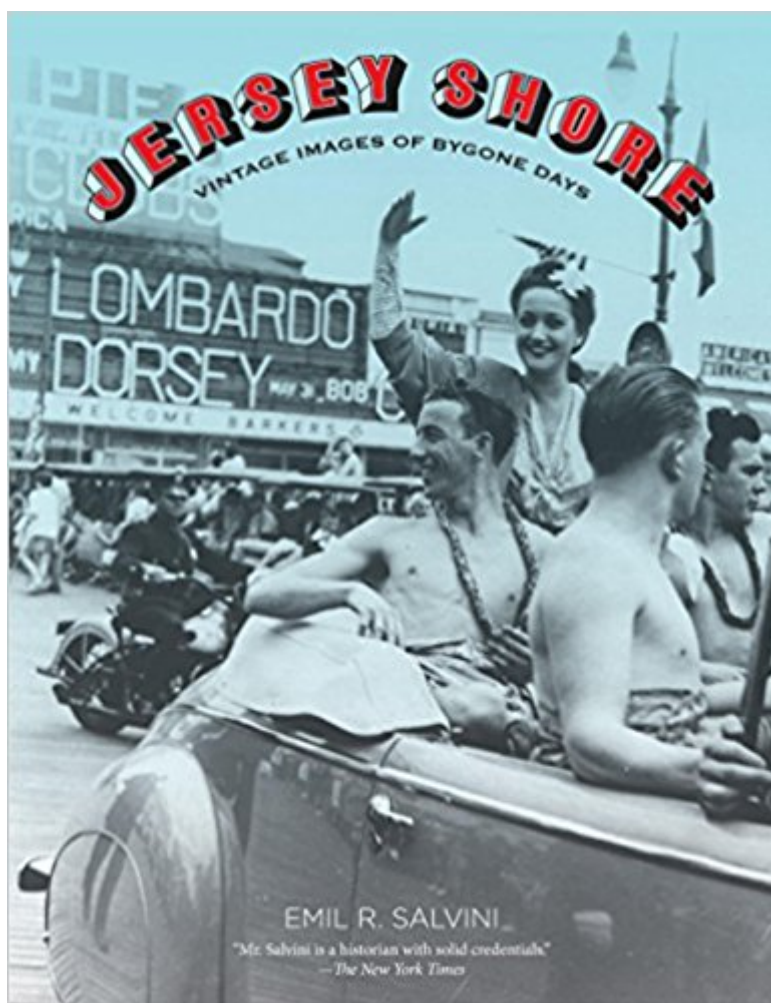

With vintage photographs capturing everything from the plunging neckline that made Marilyn Monroe a persona non grata to the whimsical architecture of Lucy the Elephant, Jersey Shore reflects the pure freedom that is summer.

Emil R. Salvini is a member of the Cape May City Historic Preservation Commission, past president of the North Jersey Highlands Historical Society, and a life member of the Cape May County Historical Society. Author of several books on New Jersey history, including *Globe Pequot's Boardwalk Memories* (2005), this Harvard Business School alum lives with his wife in Wayne, New Jersey, and spends summers in Cape May. Salvini is president of Wheel-Grace in Belleville, New

Jersey; he has more than 25 years experience in the printing industry. He is the creator of Greenprint.com and is an FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) approved printer.
