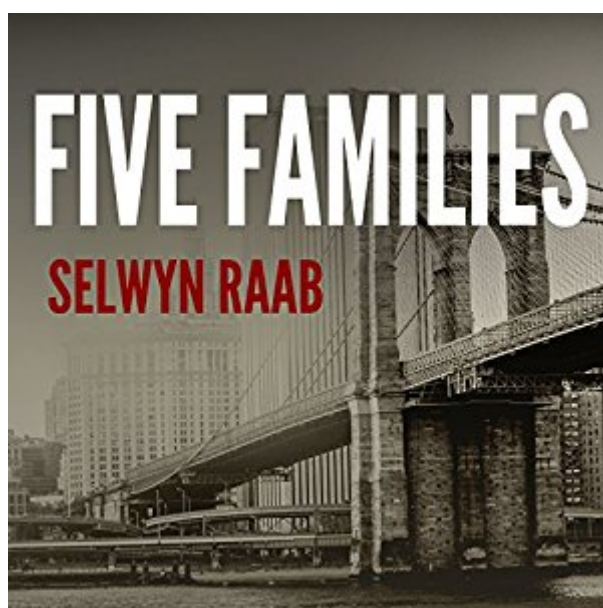

A detailed account of one of the most important criminal organizations in the history of the U.S.,

including portraits of some of its highly unsavory characters. There is no romanticizing of the Mafia here; it is revealed in all its vulgar, raw baseness. The book also shows how far and wide the Cosa Nostra has ranged in its exploitation of every human activity. This is no "Godfather" account, here the mafiosi come through in the crass cheapness of their own words as taped by law enforcement. Whether it is malignant narcissism or sociopathy, these people live only to exercise power over others, and like leeches, they suck the life from their victims in industry, in small businesses, in waste management, in gambling, in drug trade. If you want a realistic account of la Cosa Nostra, this book is for you.

I have read quite a few books on Organized crime. I was hoping that this book would be another good read and give me more information on organized crime for my own entertainment. I was fairly disappointed in the first half of the book. I know it is hard to keep things straight on what is true and what is un-true, but I have read more accounts of earlier mob events that went differently than what was described in Five Families. From another book the hit on Anistasia was a rub out for him trying to force his way into more money in Cuba. I feel like Myers Lanskey wasn't give proper credit for the behind the scenes involvement with helping Lucky start the Commission. In the book the commission comes across as just run by the Five Families, but I am unsure if this is the truth, but I was under the impression that the head of the commission had a Chicago member and Trafficante. After the first half of the book, I was very impressed with the reporting. It was very informative on how Organized crime has continued to control certain industries. I also enjoyed the break down of each family. It would have been very confusing if it all got pushed together.

I enjoyed this book so much! It has so much history and facts on the origins of organized crime.

Would have been 4 or 5 stars but I needed a program or something to keep track of everyone. I do wish though, that I had a book like this in 1970-71 when I wrote a college paper on Organized Crime. Will definitely have to revisit this book a couple more times.

Comprehensive is the word which to me best describes Mr. Raab's book. Well-researched, and to me it was interesting because it hit the main points of the New York organized crime history and development from its inception. If a person with no knowledge whatsoever of the New York organized crime scene wanted to read a book to become familiar with it, I would recommend this book. It's one of the best I have read on the subject.
