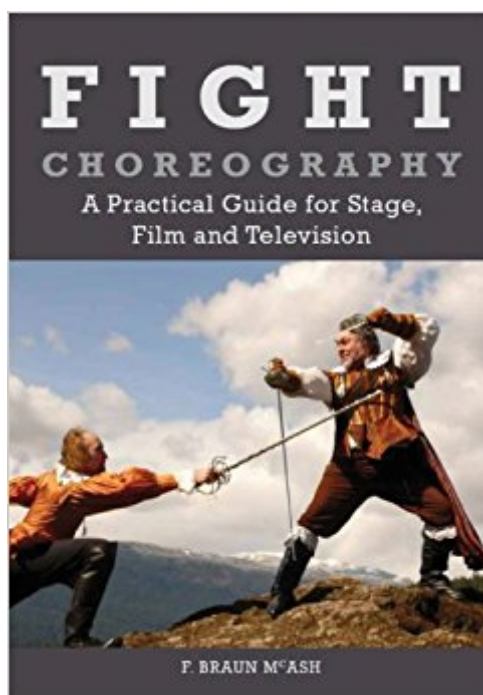

He has more than 120 professional credits in film, television, and in stage productions; including for the Stratford Shakespeare Festival and the Canadian Opera Company; but he is best known as the swordmaster for the TV series Highlander and the Highlander movie Endgame. He lives in Vancouver.

"eye-opening." I think the other works that are more fundamental, though if you'd like to hear reflections on a long, successful career, this is the book for you.

Mr. McAsh's book covers not only the long-established methodology of fight staging but also demonstrates some of the recently rediscovered research on authentic techniques. Definitely ahead of the curve.
