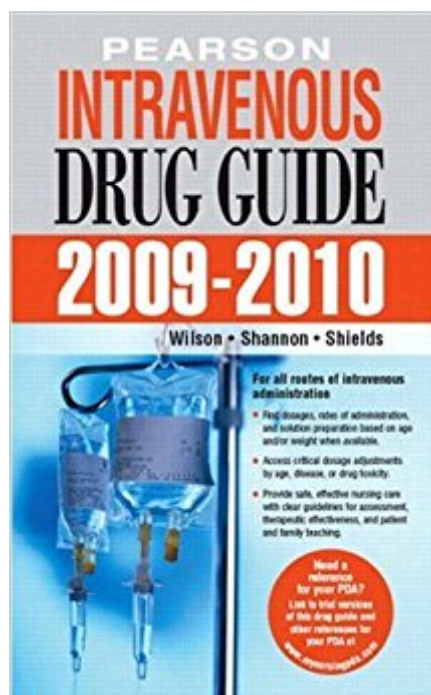


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Pearson Intravenous Drug Guide 2009-2010
