

David Wilkerson: The Cross, The Switchblade, And The Man Who Believed





Synopsis

This is the story of David Wilkerson, the man who believed against the odds that God could do great things in the rejected and ignored of New York City, who refused to give up on those on the streets even when they had given up on themselves, and who saw in the eyes of the drug addicts and gang members what others failed to seeâ "the love of Jesus Christ. But who was David Wilkerson? Many Christians donâ ™t really know. More often than not, we saw the fruit of his faith in God rather than the man himself. When Wilkerson moved to New York from rural Pennsylvania in 1958 to confront the gangs who ran the streets, he was a skinny, 120-pound man. After the initial publicity that brought him face to face with some of the most dangerous young men of the city, he largely flew under the radar of the media, using the Word of God and a bit of tough love to help men and women of the street escape the destructive spiral of drugs and violence. Wilkerson was always the real deal, full of passion and conviction, not interested in what others said was the â œrightâ • or political thing to do. Wilkerson later founded the Times Square Church, now a non-denominational mega-church of 8,000 members, to this day a crossroads for those battling sin, drugs, and pornography, and a place where the message of Christ is discussed. He created the faith-based program Teen Challenge to wean addicts off drugs, and then World Challenge, dedicated since its beginning to promoting and spreading the Gospel throughout the world. Both now have branches worldwide, continuing the work that God began in the life of one man who believed David Wilkerson was a man of faith who trusted God would give him what he needed to enter a world of crime and killing. He was a man of conviction who took the dream God gave him and marched forward without ever looking back. And he was a man of vision who could not be shaken from his beliefså "sometimes even when counseled otherwise. David Wilkerson was the preacher of New York City.

He is also the lead pastor of The Springs Church, which he and others launched in 2009 and has grown rapidly by God's grace. Gary travels nationally and internationally to conduct conferences for pastors, missionaries and Christian workers and to oversee mission ventures including church plants, orphanages, health clinics and feeding programs among the poor and unreached people of the world. Thank you Gary (and R.S.B. Sawyer) for a publishing a very honest biography about a man that had significant influence in Christianity. I put this book down thinking three words that were used to describe David Wilkerson; Humility, Prayer, Courageous. I was awestruck at how a man of such influence would turn down a meeting with the President, but go out of his way to minister to a drug addict. Wilkerson was not trying to make a name for himself or build a platform. As a pastor in an inner city I have felt the temptation to play a political card and I hosted our Congressman and mayor on a Sunday morning. Wilkerson challenged me to reject those temptations and seek to minister to those who are marginalized and overlooked. Prayer is a verb, however, it became synonymous with Wilkerson as he invested his life in prayer. This book could have summed Wilkerson's life up in one sentence, "God will make a way for a praying man", this phrase was the grand take-a-way of the book. Lastly courage is what Wilkerson modeled to pastors. He took large steps in faith and confronted gangs and crime in a way that most spiritual men would dismiss as presumptuous, he confronted the his own denominational barriers and defended his convictions when they were not popular which caused the Assemblies of God to rethink certain legalistic tendencies, namely divorce and remarriage. The biographical sketch was well written but what impacted me the most was how Gary exposed the humanness of his father. As Gary opened up about the family tension his father grew up with and with great tact and integrity illuminated his father-son relationship. This was

especially helpful for me because I have tension with my father who ministered as an itenerate preacher for several years of my adolescence. Every pastor needs to read this book in a hurry! Thank you, Edwin Handley
