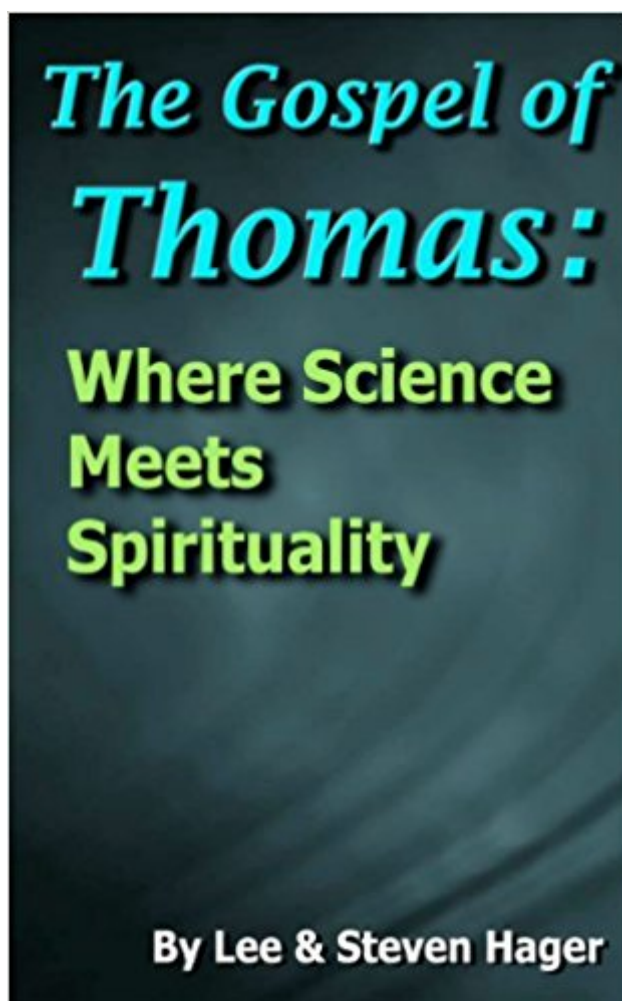


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The Gospel Of Thomas: Where Science Meets Spirituality

I think the author made mistake by referring to "Jews" as one piece. One translation of the Gospel of Thomas says: "but you have become as the Jews, for they love the tree, they hate its fruit and they love the fruit, they hate the tree" a different translation says: "Rather, you have become like the ****Judeans****, for they love the tree but hate its fruit, or they love the fruit but hate the tree." I think the more accurate translation is the second one, Christ was probably referring to 'Judeans' (not all the Jews) Judeans were members of Judah's tribe, when the Hebrew people were divided into tribes. The Tribe of Judah was only one of the twelve Tribes of Israel.... Jesus was a Jew and Christianity started as a branch in Judaism before it split and turned into a different religion
