

Through their writings and their leadership, they helped promote new and exciting religious experiences for their synagogues and for Reform Judaism around the world. Their contributions to youth summer camping helped revitalize and infuse a much-needed spirituality into late twentieth century Reform Judaism that helped set the stage for its ongoing development. In 1935 five Jewish German refugees came to study at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati, and changed the face of American Judaism. Damashek writes about their impact on us and our impact on them. One of them, Gunther Plaut, was the editor of the Reform Torah published in 1981 and still in use today in Reform Synagogues.
