

Renae de Liz is the artist of the New York Times bestseller The Last Unicorn, the creator and manager of critically acclaimed Womanthology project, and several other books including Anne Rice's Servant of the Bones, Jennifer Love Hewitt's Music Box, and her own creator-owned titled Lady Powerpunch! She works with her husband Ray Dillon (inker & colorist of all the projects listed) who she met and married at San Diego Comic-Con. They live in Cape Elizabeth, Maine with their two sons, Tycen and Drake.

This stunningly beautiful graphic novel by Renae De Liz and Ray Dillon is absolutely essential, whether you're an old fan of Wonder Woman or have never read one of her comics before. The story should feel familiar: Air Force pilot crash lands on Themyscira and is saved by Diana, who then escorts him home and fights in World War II as Wonder Woman. But there's so much more here: De Liz and Dillon expand on Diana's past on Themyscira, showing her training to become a warrior and her conflict with her mother, Hippolyta, who wants her to some day become queen. But best of all is Diana's sidekick/gal pal Etta Candy, who helps her adjust to life in America, and then follows her to France. Etta totally steals the show, even if she lets Wonder Woman have top billing.

This is simply the best book to introduce readers of all ages to the world of Wonder Woman and the wonders of Themyscira (it is also the perfect gift). The story is mature and complex, so older readers can find many layers, while remaining accessible to younger readers.Renae De Liz is both the writer and illustrator, and Ray Dillon provides vibrant colors to the book. De Liz captures perfectly the core of Diana: she is noble, idealistic, courageous, and above all, sympathetic to the suffering of others, and will do her best to help even if it means sacrificing her own self-interest. The art of the book is also on point: Diana is firmly built, tall, and not sexualized. The s and her friends are also shown to be diverse and unique. Themyscira also appears to be out of a Miyazaki movie.I hope De Liz is associated with Wonder Woman for a very long time. I just read on De Liz' Twitter account that DC had cancelled The Legend of Wonder Woman Volume 2, and I couldn't be more heartbroken. I hope there is a way for DC to listen to fans and place this series as the rightful place as one of the best Wonder Woman stories out there, and extends this series to many more volumes and spin-offs (I am hoping De Liz has a chance to tackle a Legend of the s book).
