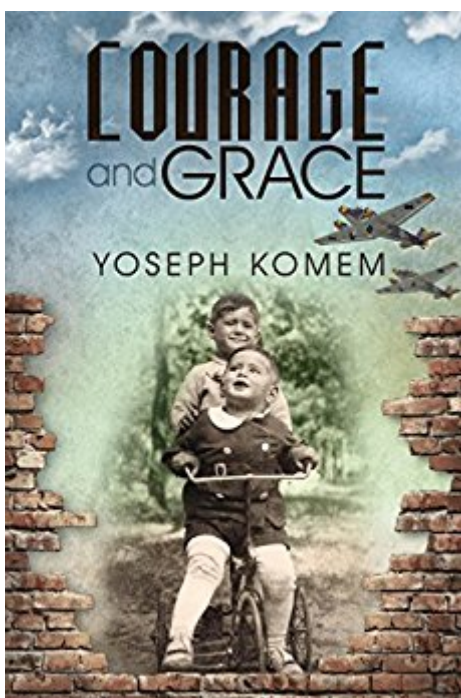

Courage and Grace by Yoseph Komem is the powerful, riveting personal account of the author's childhood memories of the Holocaust as experienced by himself, his older brother, and his parents, as well as other family members and friends. Though his Jewish father was deaf, he was able to use his ingenuity and wits to "hide in sight" of the Nazis, traveling all over German-occupied Poland, working, obtaining official-looking counterfeit documents in assumed names for himself, his family, and close friends. He also had to continue to find safe hiding places for everyone, keeping alert for neighbors who would spy on them and turn them in, forcing them to change locations before they were betrayed. Remarkably, Yoseph's entire family, his mother, father, and brother all survived, even though they spent time in the ghetto, and his mother in a camp for a time. In spite of Yoseph's tender age at the time, not old enough to enter school at the beginning of the war, his memories are very accurate, as evidenced by interviews he had with adults many years later, including some of the people who had risked their lives to hide him. Perhaps the most frightening part of this experience for him was the fact that for much of the time he was separated from other members of his family, staying with at times strangers to him, even learning to say Catholic prayers at bedtime with non-Jewish Polish children he was living with, to conceal his true identity. After the war, the family emigrated to Israel to join other family members, including his grandparents, who had moved there before the war. I highly recommend this book to everyone who yearns to learn more about the Holocaust, as this account includes facts that haven't been related by others. It is moving and powerful.
