These folders got pretty good reviews, but after my experience with this one, I would probably never recommend this product. With the exception of two things, this folder is crap. The lower price was nice, and your coins will NEVER fall out of the slots once they're locked in. This only happens though if you're actually able to get the coins into the slots in the first place. It took me forever to put my coins into this folder, and my fingers were all smashed and sore from having to force the coins into the slots. Three or four coins went in smoothly, but the overwhelming majority did not. I have two Littleton coin folders, one for pennies and one for quarters, and I love them. I bought this folder because it was cheaper than Littleton folders, but it's just not worth the struggle. I have never had any bad experience working with the other brand of folders, and I will not be going with Whitman folders again.
