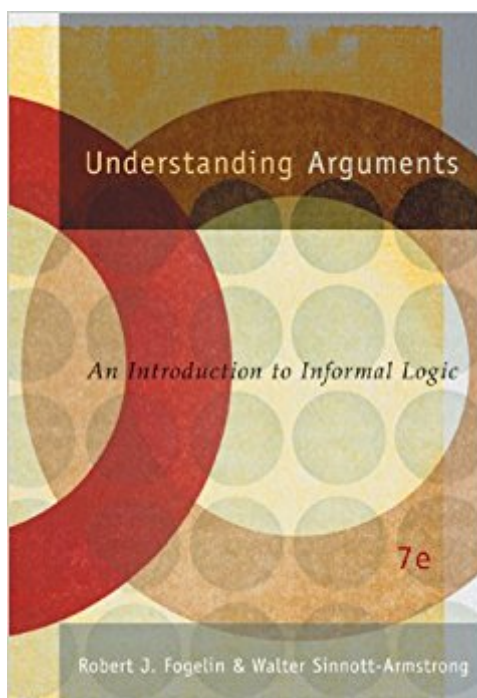

The kindle version of this book is missing symbols for THEREFOR and OR. Minor issue for me, others may have more problems with it. Besides the improper rendering issue, I felt the book was somewhat shallow and topics were not described very well. The book also does not contain any form of answer key. So you get a lot of questions/problems to work, which is nice, but there are zero answers for them. Also they do not tie everything directly back into understanding arguments. By this I mean taking an op-ed or related material and deconstructing it using everything learned. The only time this is somewhat done is within the first three chapters before learning about deductive

and inductive logic.

Not only is formal logic a little difficult for anyone who is unfamiliar, I felt as though this book was a bit round-about in its approach. One glaring problem: if you are trying to/required to learn about Truth tables, this book was awful with their explanations of how those work. The rest of the book was pretty decent, but their approach to teaching Truth Tables is ghastly.

I got this as a rental and all the pages are written on, and its tearing apart. The information in it is very useful though.
