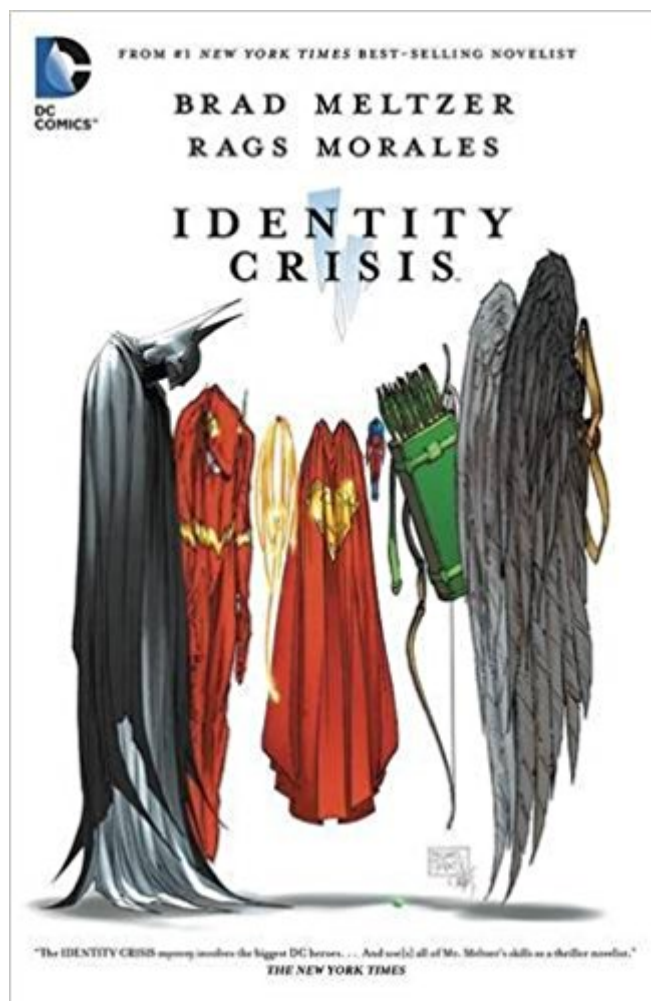

Identity Crisis is one of a handful of stories that I recommend to all my comic loving friends. It is without a doubt my favorite comic arch ever told. The story following non linear at times which can cause slight confusion for those who aren't semi-avid comic readers but this does not distract from the story one bit. All you need to know is that the story is broken into two main events, and the story surrounds those two major events in terms of layout. Meltzer does an amazing job of creating the importance of the HUMAN with the Superhuman. You will care for these characters; some of them minor characters, and ones that you would not care for otherwise. Identity Crisis is like watching a Greek Tragedy in comic form. It truly shows how helpless Superheroes can feel, and makes their identity one that is not as picture perfect as most depictions display.

Have always loved Batman and comic books, and now being older I love mysteries and mystery thrillers - this was the perfect graphic novel for me. Highly recommended.

Wonderful story

I'm really, really new at the comic scene. I've just recently begun reading comic books - I haven't even read them when I was younger. So one of the things that's really hard, when reading comic books, is to wonder whether you'll be confused out of your mind. I have to say, this is a great place to start for new readers and also old readers (obviously). Identity Crisis takes a look at our heroes who wear a mask, and who they are without it. I actually cried at a couple of parts, and when the wife of Elongated Man dies, it just breaks your heart. I didn't even know who he was, but just within a couple of pages, your heart goes out for him and you start to really wish the impossible (since you already know the outcome). And that wasn't even the end of my tears. There are more heartbreaking moments in the comics and when you find out who actually did it (I was guessing until the very end) you're just as surprised as the Justice League. What's great is that so many superheroes make appearances (not just from the Justice League, but from other superhero groups and even a couple villain groups) and it isn't confusing at all. I loved the interactions between the superheroes because you could really tell that they had been in each other's shoes before and how close some of those bonds are, even if they don't know each other on a personal level. The events are fairly direct, and the art also really moves the story along. The expressions - Ray's expression - was just amazing. Another note is that I felt like Batman was almost the center of attention, maybe not exactly the center of attention, but that's where your eyes kept wandering off towards.

Too close my collection on the whole Crisis series. Better price than the comic book stores, and first printing.
