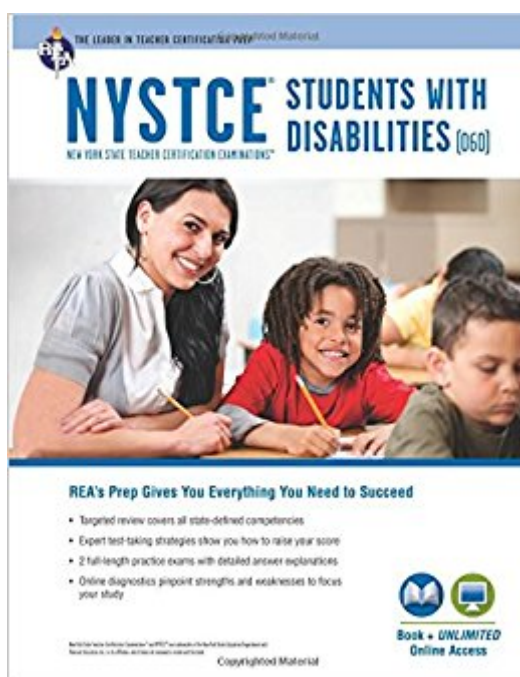

This is the best review book out there for this exam! Trust me, I've tried seven different books. It does a great job of breaking down the information into manageable sections and there is a small quiz at the end of each section. The best part is that it includes two practice tests which can be taken directly in the book or online. If you take the tests online, the company scores it for you and gives you a report showing you the exact categories where you need improvement so you can focus on those instead of wasting your time on what you already know.

This book was really helpful. It taught me all the standards for the 060. If anyone is taking the NYSTCE 060 this book will be an excellent tool. I also used it to take the 090 (the 060 safety net), the test questions were less useful but the study material/ the explanation of the standards were good prep materials.

I would use this book as a supplemental tool for the Students with Disabilities exam. Although there are many changes with the NYSTCE testing, this book mostly aligns with the SWD test framework which may be helpful. The book does give you a wide range of background information useful for the test, and practice exams but I don't feel too confident. It's not aligned with the test and some of the questions on the practice test really don't make sense to me.
